2009 ... 2010 ... THE CHOICE**

The longer I live, the more I realize the impact of attitude on life. Attitude, to me, is more important than education, than money, than circumstances, than failures, than success, than what other people think or say or do. It is more important than appearance, giftedness, or skill. It will make or break a company ... a church ... a home. The remarkable thing is we have a choice everyday regarding the attitude we embrace for that day. We cannot change our past ... we cannot change the fact that people act in a certain way. We cannot change the inevitable. The only thing we can do is play on the one string we have, and that is our attitude. I am convinced that life is 10% what happens to me and 90% how I react to it. And so it is with you ... we are in charge of our ATTITUDES.

2009 HAS ENDED! For some, it was just another year ending with the rhetorical, "I wonder where the time went?" question. For others, it didn't end soon enough. Looking back, there seems to be no end to the bad news. Unemployment ... a reality for some ... threatening for many others. Pensions wiped out and retirement in danger or put on hold. Mortgages facing possible foreclosure. Uncertainty is everywhere. Add to these financial fears the ever-present life tragedies ... death or illness of a loved one ... a child headed to or already in trouble of one kind or another ... etc., etc., etc., ... and it's no wonder that many are worried and fed up these days. No matter where they turn, they find another reason to lose sleep.

As we start this new year, it's time to take a collective deep breath and consider Chuck Swindol's words, "... life is 10% what happens to me and 90% how I react to it." Whether his 90/10% formula is correct or it is only 50/50%, there is no doubt that attitude shapes individual reactions to adversity. At one extreme, there is the anxiety-filled "Why me, God?" reaction. On the other, there is the faith-filled "Your will be done" trust in God. In the words of Albert Einstein, "There are only two ways to live your life. One is as though nothing is a miracle. The other is as though everything is a miracle." Our attitude in face of adversity reflects our response to the question, "Do you believe in miracles?"

"You say grace before meals. All right. But I say grace before the concert and the opera, and grace before the play and pantomime, and grace before I open a book, and grace before sketching, painting, swimming, fencing, boxing, walking, playing, dancing and grace before I dip the pen in the ink."

RECOGNIZING MIRACLES ... Remember when recognizing God's gift of nourishment by saying grace (thanking God) before meals was standard practice? Think about the miracle of God's creation of our food and drink. Think about the many, many miracles that are too often taken for granted ... life ... love ... family ... friends ... the beauty of the beach and the ocean ... our church ... our school ... the list is endless if we take the time to recognize these gifts in our lives. G.K. Chesterton's saying of grace (thanksgiving)

before the most ordinary of events of everyday life is the wake-up call to find God's miracles everywhere.

GRATITUDE - THE CHOICE ... God's miracles (gifts) are everywhere every day. Will they be recognized? If the choice is to ignore God's gifts or take them for granted then the result is dissatisfaction, leading to resentment, ending in self-pity. The old saw about "the cup of milk being half empty or half full" comes to mind. The miracle is the gift of the milk not the amount in the cup. Problems will enter our lives. But we have God's promise that with His help, they won't be more than we can bear. God's gift of time and His gift of grace will overcome. Gratitude is the natural result of the choice to recognize God's loving hand in our lives that will allow us to overcome current concerns or tragedies. Someone once said, "I never knew a grateful person who was unhappy, or an ungrateful person who was happy." Which will you choose in 2010?
